

Dear Rappahannock Electric Cooperative Member-Owner,

We are notifying you of an important update on our broadband partnership project in Louisa County for the area served by our Buckner substation.

Because of the large size of this particular area, it has been broken into three service zones: Bumpass, Plum Tree and Fredericks Hall. Firefly will reference these names when providing updates on their website and in the future when internet connections begin.

- Your address is located in the Fredericks Hall service zone.
- Connection to high speed internet service through Firefly in your area is expected to begin in the summer of 2024.
- Please note that even though connections are expected to start in the spring, it will still be a matter of months before Firefly can reach each individual home or business to connect internet and/or phone service.
- Once fiber construction is completed, crews will continue to the remaining four phases of the project. As a reminder of the phases and details to be completed in each phase, please visit our website, www.myrec.coop/broadband-partnerships.
